The entire fleet of MATA aircraft were launched for an all-out effort to help a local church congregation encourage residents to come visit and hear about Jesus. We were also informed that the church youth might bring their unchurched relatives. Our executive director gave a presentation during the morning service to explain mission aviation and the operations and history of MATA. We then invested the afternoon in loving the residents, providing free airplane rides, and sharing the gospel of Jesus. We gave at least seventy-three passengers a view above Darrington that


some had never seen before in their entire life. A common comment was, "I saw my house!". This event generated great excitement among locals, and we distributed thirty-two gospel presentations to children via gift cards for downloadable copies of the "Jesus Film".
